What is the theorical model you would prefer to use in analyzing religion? Describe your answer referring to key arguments discussed in the selected theorical model.
- 5. Recently, Sri Lankans have participated in various ongoing protests against the current government. Discuss what you can learn about power and politics through this experience.
- 6. "Some argue that Marxist theory adequately explains social changes". Critically evaluate the relevance of Marxist theory in explaining social changes in today's society.
- 7. "Although educational opportunity influenced upward social mobility, some argue that caste identity still prevails and shapes everyday life in Sri Lankan society" Critically examine the above statement citing appropriate cases/examples.
- 8. Examine the strengths and weaknesses of post-structuralist and post-modernist theories in explaining contemporary Sri Lankan society and culture.
