- 1) Can ethnic identity stand alone in South Asian society without any connection with other forms of identities of a person? Discuss citing relevant examples from Sri Lanka or elsewhere in South Asia.
- 2) Explain how the colonial classification of Sri Lankan people has contributed to Sri Lanka's current ethnic division.
- 3) a) Make a list of characteristics of ethnic relations in post-independent Sri Lanka. (5 Marks)
 b) Describe the nature of any **two (02)** characteristics selected from the list prepared above in shaping ethnic relations. (15 Marks)
- 4) Suppose you have been appointed by the Sri Lankan government to discuss with the so called "Sri Lankan diaspora community" in Europe to draft a new constitution for Sri Lanka with the aim of resolving ethnic tensions and conflict in Sri Lanka. Describe the major points that you will include in the agenda.
- 5) Describe the role of food preparation and consumption as a marker of ethnic boundaries in Sri Lanka or the South Asian region citing relevant examples.
- 6) Compare and contrast the constructivist approach with the instrumentalists approach which explains the shape of ethnicity and ethnic relationship in a given society.
- 7) Discuss the contribution of cyber space in intensifying the ethnic identities in Sri Lanka.
- 8) Discuss how ethnic and class relations have influenced the patterns of violence in Sri Lanka, taking relevant local examples.
- 9) Write short notes on any **FOUR (04)** of the following:
 - (i) The politicisation of ethnicity
 - (ii) Fully implementation of 13th amendment to the constitution as a solution to the ethnic problem in Sri Lanka.
 - (iii) The nature of ethno-religious tensions in the post-*aragalaya* period.
 - (iv) The forgotten or disappeared ethnic groups in Sri Lanka.
 - (v) Ending ethnic conflict via military means is as the best solution.
 - (vi) Blurring ethnic boundaries in Sri Lanka
