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

#### **Description of Process**



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Rocks are made up of minerals. Where as a mineral is a homogenous substance with specific structure and composition, a rock may contain several minerals in varying proportions. Any specific rock is therefore flexible and includes materials showing a range of

composition and texture.

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Classification of rocks is based on broad generalities. There are three broad categories of rocks, igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic.


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Igneous rocks form as a result of cooling of molten material. Sedimentary rocks form at the surface of the earth due to erosion — the action of wind, water and ice which causes rocks to break up and scatter <a href="their">their</a> components. Later they are compressed and become rocks and show a layered structure

Metamorphic rocks form by the alteration of other kinds of rocks caused by intense heat and / or pressure. <u>These rocks</u> are classified according to their degree of alteration and the nature of the rocks from which they are formed.

The development of fishing harbours, commercial harbours, landing facilities, recreational facilities have all contributed to a growing coastal population.
