- 1. It is in the interest of mankind that we perceive human communication as a dynamic process inspired by progressive values. Explain with reference to the following:
 - a) Communicators need to have mutual respect for one another to sustain a stable society.
 - b) Meaningful human communication is rooted in value cantered intrapersonal communication as it lays the foundation for all other communication actions to be honourable and dignified.
- 2. Purposeful communication helps to prevent shallow human relationships, strengthen people, and build better communities.
 - a) Making sense of the communicators involves understanding them in a socially and culturally relevant manner.
 - b) The need to lend adequate hearing while respecting their psycho-social background.
- 3. It is ironical that the power of mass communication has instilled fear among those in formidable positions in developing countries like Sri Lanka. Explain with reference to the following:
 - a) Need for a diverse source of information as well as audiences to understand social, economic, political, and cultural realities.
 - b) The capacity for critical discernment and contrary views without curbing freedom of expression through anti-democratic legislation.

- 4. The impact of globalization is often understood as detrimental to traditional societies of the developing world. Explain with reference to:
 - a) Are universal benchmarks an undue interfere in the internal affairs of comparatively smaller and weaker states.
 - b) How the involvement of global institutions like the United Nations continue to create a sober and a progressive imagination in leaders of the World.
- 5. Agenda Setting and Gatekeeping are important communication theories for media organizations with a high sense of sensitivity to national issues. Explain with reference to the following:
 - a) Explain the significance of,
 - (1) Media Agenda Setting and,
 - (2) Gatekeeping with reference to media professionalism.
 - b) How the two concepts impact on contemporary issues of national and international significance.
- 6. "Active socialization into a dominant set of values make Journalists behave in the way they do". Explain with reference to:
 - a) Significance of Occupational Socialization in professional journalism.
 - b) What are dominant values in news organizations, and should journalists abide by these values?
- 7. Communicating media messages that facilitate national development could be done meaningfully, if we respect our own traditional communication methods known to the people. Explain with reference to:
 - a) Why traditions of the people should be respected, and why traditional opinion leaders should not be underestimated.
 - b) How messages could be made relevant to intended audiences and capacity of traditional media to awaken audiences.

 - a) Attitudinal transformation through persuasion has not been maximised by the government through public service advertising.
 - b) What are the major concerns you have concerning messages coming through commercial advertising?
