Part A (25 marks)

- 1. Frustration, anger and even aggression dominate the war poems of Wilfred Owen. Using THREE (03) of the poems you have studied explore this situation.
- 2. For Siegfried Sassoon the poem is a medium for reliving the trauma of the battle. Do you agree? Argue with reference to THREE (03) of the poems you have studied.

Part B (25 marks)

- 3. Harold Pinter's *The Dumb Waiter* is a drama that challenges the idea of human bonding, especially the lack of it. Explore this statement ONLY with close reference to the text of the play.
- 4. Ben and Gus in Harold Pinter's *The Dumb Waiter* are not only criminals, but a reflection of human condition beyond the basement of their operations. Do you agree? Argue ONLY with close reference to the text of the play.

Part C (25 marks)

- 5. How does Manjula Padmanabhan bring out the theme of resistance in the play *Harvest*? Discuss with reference to TWO (02) characters in the play.
- 6. Lenny, the young narrator of *Ice Candy Man*, experiences a loss of innocence as she witnesses the violence of the partitioning of India. How far do you agree with this statement? Argue using adequate examples from the text.
- 7. "A Man of the People presents Achebe's proposal for a better society and future for Africa." Discuss the above statement with supporting evidence from the novel.

Part D (25 marks)

- 8. "An unspoken guilt can inspire women to find freedom of thought and action." Discuss the above statement with reference to the two (02) female characters, Jasmine and Wylie, in *Jasmine* by Bharati Mukerjee.
- 9. How does Jean Rhys's *Wide Sargasso Sea* explore the idea of gender in shaping individual identity and relationships? Explain your answer using examples from the text.
