4. Critically analyse the perspectives presented by Emile Durkheim and Karl Marx on the sociology of work.
5. Examine the role of traditional and new media platforms in shaping the dynamics of the public sphere in Sri Lanka.
6. Analyze the impact of digital technology on the evolution of creative industries. How has digitalization transformed the production, distribution, and consumption of creative content, and what opportunities and challenges does this present for professionals in creative sectors?
7. Discuss the impact of Covid 19 and the economic downturn on journalists in contemporary Sri Lanka. Provide examples to support your answer.
8. In what ways does objective reporting influence the selection and framing of news stories, particularly in the context of societal polarization and competing political narratives? Examine with illustrations.
