## PART - I

- 01. Define the term "Adjustment Problems" relate to children in Early Childhood and describe two (02) diagnostic criteria based on the DSM-5 classification.
- 02. Name **two (02)** barriers that children in Early Childhood and Primary Education may face when copying with challenging situations later in adulthood.
- 03. List the **four (04)** stages of Piaget's theory of cognitive development in children. Choose one stage and explain it with relevant examples.
- 04. Briefly describe two (02) stressful life events that could impact a child's academic performance or social behaviour.
- 05. Explain **two (02)** symptoms commonly observed in children with adjustment problems, using real-life examples from a school setting.
- 06. List **five (05)** emotional or behavioral characteristics that may be present in children with Special Needs due to adjustment problems.
- 07. Describe two (02) effective teaching strategies that can be implemented in Primary classroom to support children experiencing adjustment problems.
- 08. Discuss how environmental factors contribute to adjustment problems during Early Childhood, providing three (03) concrete examples.

- 09. "Imagine you are teaching a student who frequently shows aggression and sadness in the classroom"
  - i. State **two (02)** possible psychological or environmental causes for those behaviour issues. (05 marks)
  - ii. Explain how unresolved conflict during the "Initiative vs. Guilt" stage can lead to adjustment problems in primary school based on Erikson's theory of psychosocial development. (07 marks)
  - iii. Suggest four (04) actions that a teacher can take to manage the psychosocial environment in the classroom to support students experiencing adjustment problems. (08 marks)
- 10. i. Define the concept of reciprocity in classroom management. (05 marks)
  - ii. Explain three (03) competencies teachers need to develop to effectively handle children with adjustment problems. Justify your answer with suitable examples.

- iii. As a teacher, you are dealing with a child who is withdrawn and rarely speaks in class. Develop **four (04)** specific strategies based on Bandura's Social Learning Theory to support this student's adjustment. (08 marks)
- 11. i. Explain with **two (02)** examples how healthy peer interaction influence children's social development in a classroom setting. (05 marks)
  - ii. As a teacher, describe how you would use group activities to support a student facing adjustment issues. Mention at least three (03) strategies. (07 marks)
  - iii. "Sometimes children are rejected by peers due to their behavioural differences"

    Explain four (04) teacher interventions that can prevent peer rejection and promote inclusion. (08 marks)
- 12. i. Describe **two (02)** ways parents or caregivers can help children cope with emotional stress caused by family-related issues. (05 marks)
  - ii. Teachers often observe early signs of adjustment problems. Identify four (04) such signs and briefly explain. (07 marks)
  - iii. Mention four (04) services available to address adjustment problems among children and explain how each can be used to support children. (08 marks)
