Part A (40 Marks)

- Please answer one (1) question only.
- We often hear the idea that Sri Lanka is or should be 'one nation' with a shared culture. Using the different understandings of culture, discuss what this means. In your answer, focus on what this means in a plural society where there are a diversity of cultural practices.
- 2. According to recent media reports, a well-known boys' school in Colombo has established a dress code for women who visit the school. Using your knowledge of feminist theories, analyse what this means in terms of women's roles in society and forms of social control.
- 3. Using Weber's ideal types of legitimate power, discuss the power and influence of a political figure that you admire. In your answer, discuss the characteristics of this person that has allowed him or her to obtain power and how it was recognised as legitimate power by the people.
- 4. The medical degree offered by SAITM has become a very controversial topic in society today. Discuss the different positions that have been taken with regard to SAITM and explain and justify your own position on this debate using a relevant theoretical perspective on education.

- 2. Explain what Clifford Geertz means when he says that 'religion is a social construct'.
