- 04. Explain <u>two</u> procedures a school can adopt to facilitate personality development of adolescents.
- 05. Citing three examples briefly explain the impact of peer group in developing self concept of adolescents.
- 06. Explain briefly with <u>two</u> suitable examples how reinforcement can be used to shape student behaviour.
- 07. Name two techniques that can be used to facilitate transfer of learning.
- 08. Name <u>two</u> crucial changes that are taking place during adolescence and explain briefly the role of the class teacher in facilitating those changes.
