- 1. Write a brief comparative analysis of Ralph Dahrendorf's and Karl Marx's theory of conflict.
- 2. "Hannah Arendt's understanding of the displacement of politics by "the rise of the social" under modernity allows us to develop a critique of the notions of 'development' and 'public policy'. Comment on this statement giving examples.
- 3. "John Rawls' theory of distributive justice does not establish a clear justification for the right to development". Do you agree? Discuss.
- 4. "Martha Nussbaum's Capabilities Approach is the most appropriate theoretical framework for ensuring distributive justice in developing societies." Do you agree? Discuss.
- 5. Define and discuss the concept of Satyagraha as practiced by Gandhi. Describe and evaluate how it was used in the Indian independence movement and comment on its global impact.
- 6. Discuss the value of Schelling's analysis and use of the prisoner's dilemma for dealing with bargaining situations and making choices. Cite examples.
- 7. Discuss Judith Butler's concept of "performativity" in her approach to gender issues and her critique of current notions of gender and identity.
- 8. "Isaiah Berlin's concepts of liberty, equality and pluralism provide a framework of values for multi –ethnic democracy". Discuss.
