The bricks are to be laid flat on well compacted 75mm thick sand bed; the sub grade is to be manually compacted before laying the sand bed. Paved area shall be finished to a slope of 1:400. The upper edge of the paved area and the sides shall be lined with precast concrete kerbs and the lower edge provided with precast kerbs and channel units.
