Bidders are expected to submit a valid Bid Security together with the Bid.

<u>Explain</u> the circumstance under which the Employer is entitled to claim the value stated in the Bid Security from the issuing authority.

When does the bidder need to furnish the Performance Security? Under what circumstances will he be required to furnish a fresh Performance Security? (25 marks)
